## Neurological Link between Emotion and Hysterical Conversion found

In 1895, Freud hypothesized in his "Project for a Scientific Psychology" that there was a link between the motor system and emotions. Freud suggested that - in the absence of neurological findings - hysterical symptoms were the result of psychological processes i.e. "energy" was being diverted from the psychic system into the motor system when memories and their related affect could not be dealt with. A new study by Yann Cojan has found similar findings.

The Efficacy of Psychodynamic Psychotherapy by Jonathan Shedler, PhD

*Empirical evidence supports the efficacy of psychodynamic psychotherapy. Effect sizes for psychodynamic psychotherapy are as large as those reported for other therapies that have been actively*

*promoted as "empirically supported" and "evidence based." Additionally, patients who receive psychodynamic therapy maintain therapeutic gains and appear to continue to improve after treatment ends. Finally, non-psychodynamic therapies may be effective in part because the more skilled practitioners utilize techniques that have long been central to psychodynamic theory and practice. The perception that psychodynamic approaches lack empirical support does not accord with available scientific evidence and may reflect selective dissemination of research findings. In 1993, Lewis Aron and Adrienne Harris published "The Legacy of Sandor Ferenczi." Now they have published a new introduction (2009) and have made the book available online. Aron and Harris only ask that you consider donating to the Ferenczi Centre (at the New School for Social Research in New York) should you wish to download any or all of the book. They hope that these funds will allow the centre to continue to meet the following goals.

From their website....."The goals of the Ferenczi Center include: 1) sponsoring conferences and promoting research, scholarship, and publications regarding Ferenczi, 2) promoting new translations and publications of Ferenczi's writings, and 3) contributing to the ongoing vitality of psychoanalysis as a cultural, intellectual and psychotherapeutic discipline. Similar societies exist throughout Europe and we have established the Ferenczi Center with the enthusiastic support of Judit Meszaros in Budapest; Andre Haynal in Geneva; Judit Szekacs in London; Kathleen Kelley-Lainé and Michelle Moreau Ricaud in Paris; Franco Borgogno and Carlo Bonomi in Italy; Ferenc Erős the Editor of Thalassa, a Hungarian review of psychoanalysis, culture and society; and many of the leading Ferenczi scholars in Europe, as well as Edith Kurzweil, member of The New School for Social Research's Board of Governors.
